**ATTENTION:**

**Ongoing Basic obedience dog training: Puppies/Beginners/Advanced**

**Sunday morning training: Ends May 12, 2019 and will resume  
Sunday September 8, 2019. (10:30 am)**

Class will be held outside in the pavilion area, weather permitting. Otherwise classes will be held in the gym.

**Wednesday evenings: Beginning Wednesday April 10, 2019**

**7:15pm to 8:00pm – PUPPY CLASS (12 weeks to 1 year)**

**8:15pm to 9:00pm – ADULT/BEGINNER and ADVANCED Dogs.**

**(classes are held inside in the gym) Wed evening classes will continue through Sept. 11, 2019**

**NOTE:** Please observe the 2 foot rule while entering, during and leaving training. Maintain a 2 foot distance between dogs at all times.

Dogs coming to training should have a 6 ft leather leash (leashes are available to purchase at training). All dogs must be on well-fitting collars or harnesses – though proper fitting training collars are required for adult dogs larger than 20 lbs and over 6 months. No pinch collar, unless instructed by one of the trainers. For puppies under 6 months, a regular collar, fitted appropriately. **No retractable leashes.**

**Puppies must have had at least their second set of puppy vaccinations, a Bordetella vaccine and a negative fecal before attending class.**

**Didn't adopt a dog from us? You can still come to training! 100% of the training fee goes to rescuing more dogs!! So not only are you getting a well trained dog, but you are helping other dogs as well!**

***All handlers are required to wear gym shoes, or safe closed toe/back shoes. No sandals or flip-flops.***
